	The original grant is amended to reflect a close date equivalent to the date that the award was transferred and an award amount that reflects the portion of the award that was carried out at the original institution. The proposal id is appended with an "(X)". The transferred grant has a start date that reflects the date the award was transferred to the new institution and the award amount reflects the portion of the award allocated to the new institution. The proposal id is the same as the original proposal id but appended with a "(T)" rather than an "(X)". The "(X)" and "(T)" records combined reflect ONE award.
Co-Funded Awards (SFI administered)	Where SFI administers an award on behalf of itself and a co-funding partner, the award reflects the full amount of funding granted by SFI AND the co-funding partner.
